The Landing Team has developed into a cohesive, complementary team that delivers a warm, welcoming and stimulating environment where all are welcome.



Members express great pride, ownership and a positive comfort level when participating at The Landing. Friendships continue to grow, coffee shared, popcorn enjoyed and laughter fills the facility. The Landing continues to support the goal of reimagining age and fosters an environment for individuals to continue to live a full and complete life regardless of age. The Landing membership has grown by another 13% in 2023 and program participation has grown by 41%.

New programs continue to be added to meet the key areas of gathering, movement, and growth. The community partners and members continue to share their area of expertise and knowledge through programming. New programs are continuously offered and the opportunities for members, endless. Financial assistance for programing was added this year for those in need, ensuring everyone is given opportunity to participate.

The Landing purchased a shuttle bus in Fall, thanks to the support of the Dwight & Linda Davis Foundation. The shuttled has allowed us to expand our programing beyond The Landing walls. We now have four designated shuttle drivers; more programs continue to be added. Our members can now enjoy our community and the State of Wisconsin with significant fewer limitations.

In summary, our community is fortunate to have such a unique program to reduce the affects of loneliness and improve overall health of our aging population. The Landing is truly a best in class facility helping to reimaging age for seniors. We continue to strategically plan for the current and future growth and we are excited about the future of The Landing.



The YMCA & The Landings 55+ membership in January 2023 started with 4,901 members and grew to 5,523 members by the end of December 2023. 13% increase

September 2019, prior to The Landing opening, the YMCA had 1,660 55+ members. As of December 2023, membership has grown by a total of 233%


Programs
